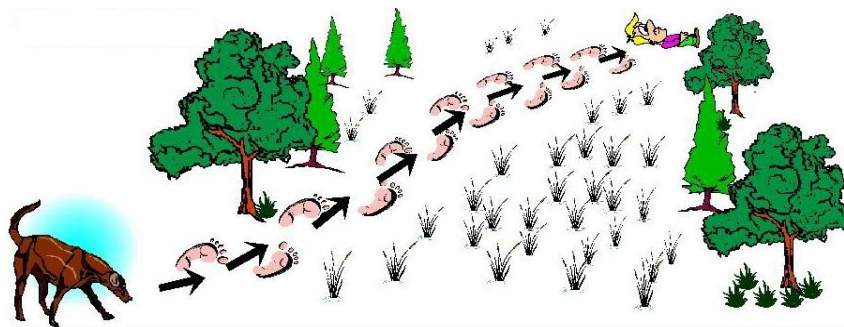

\$275 – one-time, formal evaluation to assess your dogs' drive to determine if he/she has the capacity to train to the OPP Civilian Canine Adequacy Standard. Evaluation is a prerequisite to join the once-a-month Search & Rescue Training Workshop.

\$100– once-a-month Search & Rescue Training Workshop
